

CCC Councillor David Keane's November Summary Report given on 24/11/25

- I attended consultation meetings at the Coneygear Centre and Burgess Hall, where I met residents from the village, including some directly affected by the legal letters sent. I also met the Chair of the Great Ouse Valley Trust.
- Of the three consultations I attended, the St Ives Corn Exchange had the highest turnout with approximately 1,500 visitors, compared to 160 at Burgess Hall and 60 at Coneygear Centre. I met and talked to several residents, some directly impacted, at all 3 consultations.
- I have walked the Hemingford Grey section of Route B with landowners and the common section which is open to the public. Today I attended a private meeting with homeowners, CCC representatives, and their advisors directly impacted in the village.
- I have written to the mayor and copied our MP. I also submitted a joint letter to the A141 team with Cllrs Julie Kerr and Alex Bulat (copies attached), and I have received a reply (also attached).
- I had a call with the Head of Transport for the Combined Authority to understand the next steps. The feedback from this second consultation will be reviewed and incorporated into a report, expected to be released at the end of February or early March. This report will go to the Combined Authority Transport Committee and should identify the outline preferred options, moving the scheme to the next stage: preparation of a detailed business case.
